SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. Event

Highland Car Club Ltd ("HCC") will organise a Clubmans status 12-car Navigation Rally on Sunday 4th December 2022. The event signing-on etc. will be at Fairways, Sir Walter Scott Drive, Inverness (Map Reference 674 426). There will be a total of 51 miles on public roads. The finish venue will be at Fairways, Sir Walter Scott Drive, Inverness (Map Reference 674 426), which is not the location of the final control.

2. Jurisdiction

The event will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations, and any written instructions that HCC may issue for the event.

3. Authorisation

The event complies with the requirements of The Motor Vehicles (Competitions and Trials) (Scotland) Regulations 1976.

Motorsport UK Permit Number is 126415.

4. Eligibility

This event is open to fully elected members of HCC and members of the following invited clubs: 63CC, SDMC, ADMC, NESMC.

Club membership cards will be inspected at signing-on.

5. Championships

The event will be a counter in the following HCC Club Championships (eligible to HCC members only):-

- (a) HCC Training Rally Championship.
- (b) HCC Non-Expert Rally Championship
- (c) HCC Expert Rally Championship
- (d) HCC Ian C. Smith Club Championship

The entry fee will be refunded if the competitor advises the organisers in writing prior to the closing date for entries that their entry is withdrawn.

9. Classes

Entries for the event will be divided into the following classes:-

The maximum entry for the event is 12 including reserves and the minimum is 5. The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate classes or cancel the event as necessary if the minimum numbers are not reached. Entries will be seeded in the following order: Expert, Non-Expert, Novice, Historic.

10. Maps and route instructions

Ordnance Survey Landranger (1:50,000) Map number 26, *Revised in September 2021* is required. Any feature of the map, legend or cardboard cover may be used to define the route to be taken. Competitors will be supplied with a time card and route card or route instructions as necessary during the event. These documents will provide all the information necessary for competitors to comply with R9. The correct route will be deemed to be the shortest route which complies with the instructions, and straight-on unless otherwise instructed. All mileages are deemed to be correct.

11. Timing

Cars will start at <u>ONE</u> minute intervals. Timing will be Scheduled timing by marshals' watches. A clock showing rally time will be on display at signing on.

Competitors can reduce lateness without penalty in accordance with R12.7

12. Technical regulations

All vehicles must comply with the Motorsport UK technical regulations J5 and R18. Competitors should in particular note the following:-

R6.1.1	Competitors will be identified by numbers which will be provided by the organisers. The competition number must be displayed in the window behind the Navigator's door throughout the event.
R18.3.3	induction air/filter elements must be fitted to ensure the vehicle complies with noise regulations(J5.17)
R18.5	maximum of four forward facing beams (in addition to side and indicator lights).
R18.6	vehicles must be currently registered and taxed as a private car.
R18.6.1	vehicles must not have any advertising except for event sponsor decals.
J5.20.6	a commercial type van/pick-up may be used.

13. General Regulations

The General Regulations of Motorsport UK apply except as modified below:-

H35.1.4	a Novice is defined as per paragraph 9 of these regulations.

14. Penalties

Marking and penalties will be in accordance with R Appendix 1 Chart 13 except as modified below:-

Not reporting at a Passage Control or providing proof of visiting a Route Check (e.g. a Code Board) - 15 minutes.
Failing to stop at any Stop or Give Way sign (See Blue Book Section R, Paragraph 36.2) on sections which run before 22:00hrs – 15 minutes for each offence

15. Results and awards

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after completion of the event. Any protests must be lodged in accordance with C5.

The following awards for this event will be presented at Highland Car Club's annual prize-giving:-

1st Overall Driver - Budget Trophy and perpetual award 1st Overall Navigator – Moray Firth Motors Trophy and perpetual award

1st Expert - A perpetual award to the driver and navigator 1st Non-Expert - A perpetual award to the driver and navigator 1st Novice - A perpetual award to the driver and navigator

The overall winners will be the highest placed crew in the Open class. No competitor may win more than one award.

16. Insurance

Vehicles must have Insurance in place which provides as a minimum, Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can be either by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or by purchasing additional cover as an adjunct to an existing motor policy.

If a competitor uses an extension to an existing policy, they will be required to sign a declaration that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor. If a competitor wishes to purchase additional cover via the organisers, then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following.

- (i) Age 19 years or over
- (ii) Has held a full licence for a minimum of 6 months
- (iii) Has no more than 6 points on their licence
- (iv) Has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years
- (v) The vehicle must hold a valid MOT Cert, current road insurance, and Road Tax, unless exempt from doing so.
- (vi) All competitors MUST be a named driver on the road insurance.

Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed price, if approval from Reis Motorsport Insurance has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event. Additional cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event, and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser(s).

Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event. The Event Organiser's RTA scheme is provided by Reis Motorsport Insurance and underwritten Markerstudy Insurance Services Limited.
